Please read ANY novel of your choice (this could be fiction or non - fiction) on the theme of IDENTITY during the summer. Below, you will find some suggestions (but remember, you may choose a novel that is not on the list) :

- Half of a Yellow Sun by Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie
- The Book Thief by Markus Zusak
- The Great Gatsby by F. Scott Fitzgerald
- The Kite Runner by Khaled Hosseini
- I Know Why The Caged Bird Sings by Maya Angelou
- 1984 by George Orwell
- Into the wild by Jon Krakauer
- The Crew by Bali Rai

During or after your reading, make some rough notes on the main <u>plot</u>, <u>characters</u> and the <u>theme</u> <u>of identity</u>. You will be given a task on the book you have read after the holidays....
